

Did You Know?

OPAC is the only political action committee representing the osteopathic profession at the federal level.

Recommendations for support and endorsement are based on candidate positions and work on key physician issues; as established by the osteopathic profession's legislative agenda.

If every DO in the country gave just \$10 each year to support OPAC, the osteopathic profession would have well over \$1 Million to support pro-physician candidates each cycle.

Currently, less than 5% of DOs support the profession's political efforts by contributing to OPAC.

OPAC Facts

No AOA dues are used to contribute to candidates or to support OPAC's political activities. All contributions to OPAC are voluntary contributions, separate from AOA or AOIA membership dues.

The IRS prohibits organizations with a 501(c)3 tax status, like the AOA, from political campaign activity. Therefore, you must be a member of the osteopathic profession's 501(c)6 organization, the AOIA, to receive restricted information from OPAC on races and to support OPAC financially.

The OPAC Board, made up of seven DOs, approves all endorsement and financial support of candidates for Congress.



OPAC Clubs

OPAC recognizes annual club members through signage at major meetings and on the website as well as special events at major meetings of the profession. Club members are those major donors who give at various levels each year.
